Three Ministers resign as SA Premier announces Cabinet reshuffle

Three South Australian Ministers and the state's Legislative Council president have resigned over the State Government's expenses saga. Transport Minister Stephan Knoll, Primary Industries Minister Tim Whetstone and Trade Minister David Ridgway will leave their posts in Premier Steven Marshall's Cabinet. Federal Parliament to be cancelled amid growing interstate COVID-19 outbreaks

The next sitting of Federal Parliament will be cancelled because of the risk of COVID-19 transmission as cases rise in NSW and Victoria. Parliament was going to sit for a fortnight from August 4 but the next sitting week, in which the government can pass legislation and the opposition can scrutinise its agenda, will now be from August 24.
